Susan M. Ugai, being first duly sworn, states that the following is true to the best of her knowledge and belief;

- 1. She is an Assistant Attorney General for the State of Nebraska.
- 2. On February 22, 1991, Michael P. Flanagan received one letter addressed to "The Douglas County Grand Jury, ATTN: Foreman Michael Flanagan", from John W. DeCamp of DeCamp Legal Services, P.C.
  - 3. Michael P. Flanagan did accept receipt of the letter.

- 4. The letter contained a Notice and Acknowledgement of Receipt of Alias Summons and Complaint directed to "The Douglas County Grand Jury, ATTN: Michael Flanagan, Foreman" and a copy of the petition filed in the above-referenced case which appears to be a civil rights action brought pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983 and a suit for damages.
- 5. In her position with the Attorney General's Office, affiant is responsible for reviewing assigned litigation that involves the employees of the State of Nebraska.
- 6. In the complaint, the plaintiff alleges a deprivation of civil rights, slander, and violations of due process associated with the operation of the grand jury.
- 7. Plaintiff alleges that Michael Flanagan was the Foreman of the Douglas County Grand Jury and sues him as an individual.
- 8. Plaintiff further makes general allegations against the Douglas County Grand Jury, presumably in their official capacity, since none of the jurors with the exception of defendant Flanagan were named as individuals.
- 9. For these reasons, it is clear that the plaintiff is attempting to serve the defendant Douglas County Grand Jury by mailing the summons to Michael Flanagan.
- 10. In the State of Nebraska grand juries may be called by the district courts or by petition of registered voters pursuant to Neb.Rev.Stat. § 29-1401 (Reissue 1989).
- 11. The Douglas County Grand Jury convened for the purpose of investigating the allegations included within the petition in this case has completed its duties and is no longer in session.
- 12. Defendant Flanagan is not currently the Foreman of the Douglas Grand Jury, if any such body presently exists, and has no statutory or legal authority to accept service for the legal entity entitled as the Douglas County Grand Jury.
- 13. For the foregoing reasons, affiant is returning the summons, the original of which is attached to this return of service, to this court unexecuted.


